

THE LABOUR LEAFLET.

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THE DUTY OF WORKERS

Is to get themselves united, first in twos and threes, etc., then in branches or groups, then into one Great Body, and to get up an intellectual, genuinely earnest, honest, and Plan of Action — the plan to be made plain to all those whom it will benefit. The workers must move by a general awakening under proper instructions devised among themselves.

2. FOR EMANCIPATION, whether under a mutual and social influence or a political form of action, each group or branch within each county must be properly combined, forming a section ; sections grouped together forming a nation ; nations grouped together — internationally.

3. MEMBERS must put Servants to lead the movement who know their book properly concerning the Labour Crusade, the avenue to Socialism, or in other words the Social Revolution.

4. THE CAUSE of all grievances of the workers ; all injustices and dishonesties, etc., practised upon them by the idle, rich, predatory class must be known, and taught in a threefold nature ; — First — To intellectually understand every new departure or ideal step forwarding the demands of concessions to be practicable. Second — To be unanimous how to bring concessions without causing injury and inhuman sufferings of others. Third — How to economically enjoy and make a good use of all that is got, and to keep it.

5. A large number of sectional and intersectional Secretaries must be appointed every new year, their duty, being through which to centrifugal correspondence , and labour literature on all the various questions as required by members. The duty of members is to send to their Secretary their new address always when they change their residence.

6. Sectional and National Deputy Committees must be selected every spring and also when necessary at other times. Each branch, group, and section to have representation through them, and also as Deputy Service Committee to serve in attendance at national and International Conventions, etc., when necessary.

7. It must always be tried and trustworthy members of courage and honesty of purpose that should be elected, and voting on all matters of importance, socialised according to number of members represented by each “deputy,” for instance one vote for certain numbers of members and voted upon by ballot.

8. BLOOD MONEY or Blood Wealth is that division of it, (the symbol of labour) which is got by those who continually live in luxury and idleness of the fruits of labour of any kind — a community of workers," be it rent, interest, royalties, pensions, unjust salaries, dishonest profits, etc., or any kind — blood money.

9. THE AVENUE to Socialism, the Social Revolution now going on, means that all wealth be socialized for them who labour by bringing in law and custom privileges and conditions of honesty, instead of the dishonesty which exist. If the workers do not awaken and make effort themselves they cannot expect unity to exist, nor social reform to come about, nor can those who object be known as scabs, blacklegs, knaves, fools, tools, etc., and challenged to unite.

TO SPREAD the principles of Socialism among the people, and to acknowledge truth, justice and morality as a basis of their behaviour among themselves and towards all their fellow-men; without regard to colour, creed, or morality. THE SCOTTISH SOCIALIST FEDERATION is founded at Edinburgh. Those interested can be introduced to that organisation by me — R.D.

The Socialistic movement in North Britain.

The Scottish Socialistic School and Union has issued the following declaration of Principles :—

Labour is the Torch of all wealth therefore all wealth belongs: to Labour, and all who labour are justly entitled to the full value of labour performed or else to the product itself.

No man has a right to live in idleness on the fruits of other men's labour.

It is an injustice that the working class should be condemned to a life of unending and ill-paid toil, while another class enjoys a life of idle and extravagant luxury.

All men are by right entitled to the possession of property which is the result of their own labour and skill.

The earth on which we live was not created by man, therefore no man has a right to the private ownership of it.

It is the duty of every man to labour for his living ; therefore every man has a right to do so. Any system of society which prevents a man performing his duty or any system of laws which deprives a man of a natural and inherent right, is wrong to the individual and hurtful to the community of which he is a member and should therefore be abolished. All are therefore urged to demand by political and social influence. (1) Shorter hours of labour. (2) The just value of the labour performed. (3) The right of access to and use of the land. (4) That the rent of land and the land itself with all its contents shall become the inalienable property of the Community instead of the private property of individuals. (5) Money. A National system of circulation, not borrowed, but *state* supplied on labour value.
